


Problem Wk.5.3.2: Every other

Write a procedure that takes a list as input and returns a new list with alternating elements of the original list, starting with the first. So, you'd get

```
>>> everyOther([1, 2, 3, 4, 5])
[1, 3, 5]
>>> everyOther(['this', 'is', 'a', 'sentence'])
['this', 'a']
```
